Dear Parishioners

Pope Francis has announced that 2025 will be a Jubilee Year, the theme for Jubilee 2025 is "Pilgrims of Hope," and it will be a year of hope for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing effects of COVID-19 pandemic, and the climate crisis. The Jubilee year happens every 25 years.

The Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican is opened on 24 December 2024, thus starting the Jubilee year.

As we know, the Jubilee is a special year of grace, a special year of forgiveness and reconciliation, in which the Church offers the faithful the possibility of asking for plenary indulgence, that is, the remission of sins for themselves or for deceased relatives.

Pope Francis is calling on all Catholics to renew in the hope of Christ, using St. Paul the Apostle as a guide for this special year. In the words of the pope "For all of us, may the Jubilee be an opportunity to be renewed in hope. God's word helps us find reasons for that hope"

The papal basilicas of St Mary Major, St John the Lateran and the Paul outside the wall will be opening their jubilee doors in December and January, and there will be designated Jubilee churches in our diocese to visit.

The Ordinary Jubilee will end with the closing of the Holy Door of the Papal Basilica of St. Peter in the Vatican on 6 January 2026, the Epiphany of the Lord.

IMPORTANT SCAM EMAILS IMPERSONATING PARISH PRIESTS - The ICT department of the Archdiocese is drawing to our attention the concerning rise in scam email targeting parishioners. These emails impersonate the parish priest, often using a similar email name and masking the real email address. They typically request the recipient to purchase Amazon or other gift cards as gifts for the priest. A number of parishioners have fallen victim to these scams, with some individuals losing up to £600 to the fraudsters. We have been asked to spread awareness of these emails and what to look for:-

- Never purchase gift cards as gifts for the parish priest based on an email request, unless we have verified the request directly in person or through trusted means. -
- Double -check any suspicious email by directly contacting the parish office. -
- Avoid sharing personal financial information in response to unsolicited emails.

If you encounter any of these emails, please report them as spam and inform the parish office immediately.


