This weekend, on the Feast of Christ the King, we celebrate World Youth Sunday, "this day is an opportunity to recognise young people as a gift in the Church, enable the youth ministry and parish community to celebrate young people and affirm the contribution of young people in the Church and those who work with them"

In these months of October and November we are celebrating the 1st year since we started our parish Youth Ministry with a new organisation and fresh volunteer youth ministers.

Here at SWOY Parish our youth group is made up of a group of young people and adolescents who meet once a month in our parish centre.

THIS SUNDAY'S READINGS -2 Samuel 5:1-3, Colossians 1:12-20, Luke 23:35-43

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION -As he dies on the cross, Jesus is jeered and mocked, he is stripped and killed. National and faith leaders laugh at him. A hostile crowd watches.

In this context the fact that anyone recognises and acknowledges Jesus as a King is astounding. But a solitary voice is perceptive and brave enough to the truth behind the mocking inscription over Jesus' head calling him the "King of the Jews". One voice alone sees Jesus as a King arriving triumphantly into his Kingdom. But the prophet who recognises Jesus as a King is a convicted criminal, an acknowledged sinner. It is this outcast who is welcomed into the Kingdom.

Today's Gospel tells us everything we need to know about today's feast of Christ the King. It tells us about the Kingship of Christ – unspeakable suffering showing the power and glory of God, which is infinite love. And it tells us about the vocation of the church – a community of dearly loved sinners who dare to recognise Jesus as their King and are welcomed into his Kingdom.
