FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT (A) 30 NOVEMBER 2025

Dear Parishioners

Today we begin the season of Advent, which is the time of hopeful waiting to the coming of our saviour. Advent is a time of prayerful silence and recollection, in which we strive to listen to the word that wants to come to us and to pay attention to his approaching footsteps.

Advent is not only a time of liturgical preparation for Christmas, but a journey of conversion, in this precious time, we strive to learn and recognise Jesus who continually comes to meet us in the faces of people and especially of the poor and the marginalized. It is a time in which the word invites us to be vigilant but also to act, to let ourselves be touched by the wounds of our brothers and sisters, to become a credible sign of Jesus's love.

Let us try to pray and try to learn from Jesus' love, generosity and charity towards us, so that we can relate to our brothers and sisters in the same spirit of charity and love, our faith becomes visible when we look after others. During advent here in our parish we make a special collection for the homeless and to those who are in need within our community. let us be as generous as charitable as we can in this time of grace.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION -In each year of the three-year cycle the Advent Sunday gospelreadings have the same pattern: the first is about the final Coming of Christ. In the second John the Baptist is preparing a community of repentance to welcome Jesus' mission. In the third John the Baptist points out Jesus as the Messiah. On the fourth Sunday we look to Mary preparing for the birth of her Son. In this Sunday's reading about the Second Coming the accent is the same as in the Paul's letter to the Romans (today's second reading): we have a pressing and urgent need to take action without delay. The Second Coming will be sudden and unexpected as when a thief breaks in at night and no protective preparations have been made; it will also seem random and apparently without discernible cause, as when one person is taken, another left behind. We do not even know whether that final confrontation (when each of us is brought face to face with the awesome presence of God) will be a unique event for each of us at death, or whether it will be a group event, as is suggested by Matthew's parable of the sheep and goats sent to right and left. There is no time in eternity, no waiting-room! It will not be as any human mind can envisage it. Should we look forward to or dread the final meeting with the Lord? Dom Henry Wansbrough OSB
